


Blessed Paul Peter Gojdich, O.S.B.M. (17 July 1888 – 17 July 1960), was a Rusyn Basilian monk and the bishop of the Greek Catholics in the Eparchy of Prešov, which extended to all of Czechoslovakia, where he was martyred by the communist regime. He was beatified by Pope St. John Paul II in 2001 and recognized as Righteous Among the Nations by Yad Vashem Holocaust Memorial in Jerusalem in 2007. Bishop Gojdich risked his own life to save anyone who asked for his assistance; he never thought of his own safety but helped everyone. He reminded people of the basic principle that every human being has equal rights when he faces God. His motto as bishop - God is love, let us love Him! - expresses the motivation for all of his sacrifices and acts of love throughout his life. Society of Blessed Paul Gojdich Membership

There are a number of ways to include the Eparchy of Parma in your estate and become a member of the Society of Blessed Paul Gojdich:

- Through a bequest in your Will or Trust, either of a specific dollar amount, a percentage of assets, or as a remainder of contingent beneficiary
- By designating the Eparchy as a partial or full beneficiary of an IRA or retirement account
- By naming the Eparchy as the beneficiary, or perhaps even the owner, of a new or existing life insurance policy
- With a Payable on Death or Transfer on Death designation of a bank or brokerage account
